

So far as the industrials are concerned it looks to us as if on rallies such as occurred to-day the market is a sure sale. The recent capers cut by the trust stocks dispose of all possibility of outside patronage or support in such stocks. More than that there are suggestions that perhaps all has not yet been exposed which is known of the unfortunate situation in the inside of some of these stocks.
