They will then go to the Municipality of Clare where it is said they will spend a two weeks' vacation, residing in Church Point.

Mr. Parsons has been instructed to take proceedings against the parties involved if the evidence warrants it.

Local Happenings

The regular June term of the Supreme Court will begin at Bridgetown on the 16th. It is understood that Hon. Mr. Justice Ritchie will preside.

It is announced that Rev. C. A. Munro, former of Annapolis Royal, and lately in New Aberdeen, C. B., has accepted a call to the United Church (Methodist and Presbyterian) in Newport, Hants Co., to take charge this summer.

Vice-President G. H. Hill of the C.P.R., arrived in Digby last Wednesday, where he was met by General Manager George E. Graham, of the D.A.R. They proceeded to Yarmouth, returning to Kentville Wednesday evening. The Vice-President is understood to have been making an inspection of the road and incidentally enjoying the apple blossom. He was accompanied by E. H. Tompkins, Supt. of Motive Power; W. J. Zwickel, Master Mechanic; F. M. Woodman, General Superintendent; C. Whittier, H. Derby, W. S. Bourne, all of the C.P.R.; V. G. R. Vickary, President of Y. Holdreth & Co., Yarmouth, and Col. Duff, Secretary of the St. John Dry Dock Company.

Salmon catches during the past week or so have been unusually good. Mr. Aved Butler got a little over ten hundred pounds of salmon from his weir at Hampden in two successive tides. The fish weighed up in the case of the largest to about thirteen pounds. The two fish catches mentioned above Mr. Butler believes is a record for this part of the Bay at least.

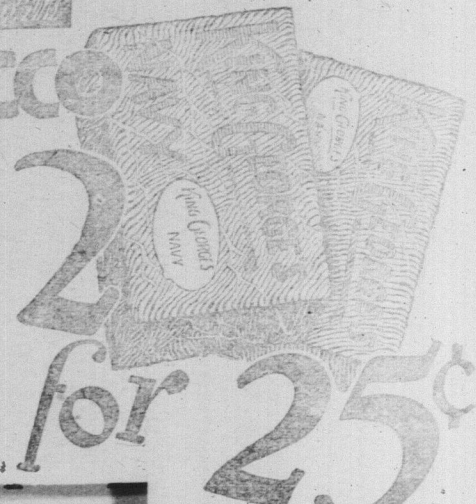
