One reinforcement of forty men under Segt-Major Kirk left yesterday morning and soven more in the afternoon. Poundmaker says he will resist the police, and Major Crozier says he will take his men. Trouble is anticipated. The Stony Indians heretofore friendly are reported leaving their reserve for the scene of action. The great thirst dance at Poundmaker's reserve was concluded last evening. Considerable excitement prevails in town. A company of home guards has been organized, arms of home guards has been organized, arms made for an emergency.
