

BAKED AFFLES.—Pare as many apples as you wish of some variety, neither sweet nor sour; core them by using an apple-corer or a steel fork; set them in biscult tins and fill the cavities with sugar, a little butter, and some ground cinamon, if you like. Set them in the oven and take until done.

POACHED EGGS WITH CREAM.—Add a niblicapoonful of Vinegar and a little salt to a frying-pan of hot water. Break the eggs casefully into this. Cook much or little as best liked, akim out carefully and place on buttered toast. Have a cup of milk heating in a sauce-pan, thicken with a teaspoonful only of corn starch, add a large spoonful of butter, season with salt, and pour over the eggs. This is a very nice tea-dish.

COCOANUT CAKE.—One half cupful butter, one cupful sugar, one half cupful sweet milk, two cupfuls of flour, two teaspoonfuls haking powder, salt, three eggs, whites of two taken out for icing. Fronting:—Whites of two eggs beaten to a stiff froth with egglanter, then a teaspoonful at a time, aid twenty teaspoonfuls powdered sugar, stirring it with a knife. Bake cake in jelly-cake tins, spread each cake with icing, and sprinkle each evenly and thickly with dessicated cocoanut.

APPLE GINGER.—An excellent, inexpensive and easily prepared sweetmeat is the following: Make a syrup of three pounds of sugar and a large cup of water; add to this five pounds of chopped apply and two ounces of chopped green ginger, and let it boil till the apples look clear. The appler must be cored—and, unless the skin is tender, pared and chopped about a five as for mince premat. If the apples are very tart more sugar may be needed, and a larger proportion of ginger will be prepared by some. This is a good accompaniment to meal, and will be a favourite in most families after it is adjusted to the especial taste for sweetness and ginger, which can only be done by trial. HOW TO COOK OAT MEAL-If possible soak the meal over night. A coffee cup of oat meal will suffice for five or six persons for a breakfast dish. It is seldom couled soft a breaking dish. It is sellow cooked sufficiently. Let it cook an hour at least. Stir the cupful of meal gradually into boiling water; let it boil snartly at first, then set it back where it will not boil so fast. Do not forget to salt the water before putting in the oat meal; if neglected, the porridge will be almust tasteless. A very appetizing and satisfying breakfast dish can be made from fried oatmeal. Cook it the day before, in the same manner as for mush, and pour it into a deep earthen dish to cool, the same as used for moulding Indian mush for the same purpose. Have it thoroughly done, so thick as to be firm and dry when colds. Cut in this slices, fry in butter and serve with gyrup.

A PERILOUS FORM OF MENTAL EFFORI.—In an article on "Mental Reflexes," in the "Lancet," Dr. J. Mortpher Granville observes: "A frequent cause of failure in the faculty of attention is striving to think of more than one thing at a time.
