

DIOCESAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE, COBOURG.

The following Scholarships will be open for competition and awarded according to the results of a General Examination to be held at Cobourg, on Wednesday and Thursday, the 14th and 15th August, 1850.—

Two of £40 Sterling per annum, each, founded by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, to enable the students to attend the Theological and Divinity Schools in this Diocese.

Two of £40 Sterling per annum, each, chargeable upon the Bishop's Students' Fund in this Diocese.

All the above have date to the successful Candidates from the 1st October following.

The Scholarship will be tenable for more than four years, and the age of Candidates must not be under 19.

Candidates for the Scholarships above announced, will be required to communicate their intention, offering themselves as Candidates, to the Rector of the Theological Seminary, at Cobourg, on or before the 1st July, 1850.—their application to be accompanied with testimonials as to their moral and religious deportment for the three years preceding, and their fitness for the work of the Ministry, from at least two licensed Clergymen in the Diocese, in which they reside. With every offer, they must also be accompanied by a Certificate from the Registrar, as to their standing in the subjects for the Examination above announced, as detailed as follows:—

- Homer, Odyssey, Book XIV.
- Hesiod, Works and Days.
- Virgil, Bucolics, Book IV.
- Livy, Hist., Book 1.
- Gregory, Pastoral Care, 2.
- Algebra, to end of Simple Equations.

Persons who are desirous of attending the Theological and Divinity Schools in this Diocese, should apply to the Registrar of the Theological Seminary at Cobourg, on or before the 1st July, 1850.
