

BEEN PROPOSED. TABLED OR ADOPTED ONLY TWENTY HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED AS BEING OF POSSIBLE INTEREST TO THE FISHERIES SECTOR. OF THESE, THERE ARE FOUR THAT DEAL SPECIFICALLY WITH TRADE IN FISH PRODUCTS AND ONLY ONE HAS BEEN TABLED. IT IS THE ONE THAT RELATES TO THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE EVisCERATION OF FISH PRIOR TO ITS MARKETING. ALSO HERE ARE SOME EXAMPLES OF GENERAL DIRECTIVES COMMON TO THE AGRI-FOOD INDUSTRY:

A) THE DIRECTIVE ON ADDITIVES IN FOOD PRODUCTS.

THIS TEXT IS AIMED AT AVOIDING NATIONAL MEASURES ON ADDITIVES HARMING THE FREE MOVEMENT OF THE PRODUCTS. THE ADDITIVES WHICH CONFORM TO THE DIRECTIVE SHOULD CIRCULATE FREELY AS FROM THE BEGINNING OF 1991; THE ADDITIVES WHICH DO NOT CONFORM SHOULD BE BANNED AS FROM THE BEGINNING OF 1992.

B) THE DIRECTIVE ON FROZEN FOODS. THE PRODUCTS

WHICH CONFORM TO THE DIRECTIVE SHOULD BE FREELY ADMITTED IN ALL THE MEMBER STATES AS FROM JUNE 1990; AT THE BEGINNING OF 1991, TRADE IN PRODUCTS WHICH DO NOT CONFORM WILL BE BANNED.

C) THE DIRECTIVE ON MATERIALS AND OBJECTS WHICH ARE DESTINED TO COME INTO CONTACT WITH FOODSTUFFS.
