An Act to amend The Meat and Canned Foods Act.

"Dry lobster meat."

1. Paragraph (j) of section two of *The Meat and Canned Foods Act*, chapter twenty-seven of the statutes of 1907, as enacted by chapter thirty-three of the statutes of 1917, is amended by inserting the words "(which has been processed)" after the word "can" in the first line thereof.

Contents and size of cans of lobster.

2. Section twelve D of the said Act, as enacted by chapter thirty-three of the statutes of 1917, is hereby 10 repealed, and the following is substituted therefor:—

"12D. There shall be four sizes of cans for canning lobsters. The cans of each size shall each contain not less than three ounces avoirdupois, six ounces avoirdupois, nine ounces avoirdupois and twelve ounces avoirdupois, 15 respectively, of dry lobster meat. No other size of can shall be used for packing lobsters without first obtaining the written permission of the Minister. Such written permission shall state the minimum amount of dry lobster meat that is to be packed in each size of can so authorized."
