Mr. Lewis: Mr. Speaker, on October 23 I placed some questions on the Order Paper with respect to expenditures on foreign aid during the fiscal year 1968-69. That was quite a few months ago. I wonder whether the Secretary of State for External Affairs could see to it that the questions are answered without much more delay?

Mr. Broadbent: Mr. Speaker, on October 23, almost five months ago, I placed questions Nos. 162 to 171 on the order paper. It would seem to me that answers are long overdue. I wonder if this delay could be looked into as well?

Mr. Forest: To answer the hon. member, I would point out that the answers to his questions involve some 800 companies and that the tracing of the ultimate ownership of these companies is a long process. However, the answers should be forthcoming shortly.

Mr. Burton: On December 9 I placed a question on the order paper concerning consultations between the government of Saskatchewan and the government of Canada on the subject of potash. The question was relatively simple to deal with and I had hoped it would be possible to supply the information before now.
