University, which represents all institutions
from the side of reason, can perform this task
aright. It is in the University, therefore, that
Commerce and the minor institutions that go to
make up commerce seek for guidance in those social
and economic conflicts that threaten to rend
society asunder.

To have established in this way the philosophical right of Commerce to adequate representation
in the University really wins the whole of the battle
for us. Afterwards one is in a position to deal
confidently with such assertions as those I have
quoted. I have elsewhere answered them after the
following fashion:-

I have pointed out that the profit-making motive is no more essential to business than to the practice of medicine and law, and that the University does not sponsor it further than to the extent latent in the expression, "the labourer is worthy of his hire". I have further pointed out that the modern business man must develop powers of initiative and adaptability to enable him to deal
