However, as regards the public service, there
were some anomalies, which
presented difficulties. In the first place
representatives were elected by the people
from among themselves, and the members
of the party in power were not necessarily
elected from among their own supporters.
This was particularly true of the
members of the executive, who
were appointed by the president.
