to avoid giving them even the least Shadow
for suspecting, that any illegal Encroachments upon their Territories are projected; for I can scarcely believe, that
there is so great a Monster in Existence, as
really to form any Designs of this Nature, when he considers, that in order to
gratify a worthless, upstart, rapacious Sycophant, he must involve whole Provinces
in Ruin, Blood and Desolation *.
