MODERATE TRADE AT THE MARKET

Farmers' Wagons Absent at St. Lawrence Market, Expecting Load of Spinach.

The portions of the St. Lawrence Market devoted to the farmers' wagons and basket produce were again deserted this morning, with the exception of one lonely wagon filled with spinach, and, as the buyers were notable for their absence, this was offered at a very low figure.

The flower booths were a little more active, and had quite a variety of sturdy bedding beauties, chief among which were the showy scarlet geraniums, saucy panicles, large double-white petunias and brilliant salvia, with such a contrast between the bright scarlet flowers and soft, sage-green leaves.

The meat section was as carefully clean as usual, and in passing one noticed some first-class cuts of boiling beef at a reasonable price, as well as the more expensive portions, with the portion of tenderloin. The vegetables in the gardeners' area were quite fresh and of great variety.

LEFT OVER CATTLE DROPPED IN PRICE

Trade Slow at Union Stock Yards, Except in Choicest Offerings.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards were 21 carloads, comprising 230 cattle, 1484 hogs, 102 sheep and lambs and 174 calves.

Trade in cattle was a very tame affair. None of the buyers seemingly were very anxious, having got a fairly good supply on Monday's market. Also the fresh receipts were not what could be called large lots with what were left over from Monday, they constituted a number of small lots, and after the fresh arrivals had been looked over, and some purchases made, trade began to show an almost stagnant condition.

Choice feeders were scarce, but values were no lower for both feeders and stockers when quality is considered. The best calves sold at very firm prices, as the run was light.

Sheep and lambs were firm, especially the spring lambs which sold at very firm prices, ranging from \$8 to \$10 each. Hogs were easy at Monday's quotations.

Choice load of steers sold at \$8.25 to \$8.40, and one load at \$8.50; good to choice lot of steers, \$7.75 to \$8.10; medium to good, \$7.50 to \$7.80; choice cows, \$7.75 to \$7.90; good cows, \$7.50 to \$7.65; \$7.75 to \$7.85; bulls, \$4.50 to \$7.65.

Receipts of stockers and feeders were very few, and the quality of good quality steers, \$7.50 to \$7.75; medium steers, \$7.25 to \$7.40; stockers, \$6.75 to \$7.10. Milk and calves.

Receipts of choice milkers and springers were light, but prices remain firm for the best grades. The best grades of cows, \$5 to \$80 each.

Receipts were moderate, quality common and medium, and prices firm. Common calves at \$7 to \$7.50; medium at \$8 to \$8.50; good to choice, \$8.50 to \$10.

Receipts of hogs were liberal and prices steady. Heavy fat, \$4 to \$5.50; light to medium, \$3.75 to \$4.50; and clipped, \$3 to 75c per cwt. Loss, Spring lambs, \$5 to \$8 each.
