

sent out by the Secretary of the College on November 1st or as soon after as possible. It shall be the duty of the College Board to make all needful arrangements and regulations for the issue of the voting papers and whatever may be required for carrying out the election. The voting papers must reach the College for the Secretary by 12 o'clock p.m. on December 31st. The Chancellor or Vice-Chancellor shall on the first of January following or as soon after as possible, declare who have been elected.

At the first election four shall be voted for. The two of them having most votes shall be members of Council for four years till January 1st, 1893. The other two shall be members of Council for two years till January 1st, 1891. After the first election two shall be elected in the same way at the same time every two years. In the case of a vacancy from any cause during the tenure of office the Chancellor may direct the holding of an election, in which at least six weeks must elapse between the issuing of the voting papers and the close of the period for their return and the person elected shall hold office for the remainder of the time during which the office was tenable by the person who vacated it.

In case of an equality of votes the Chancellor shall determine the elected Member.

No member of Senate shall be eligible for election who is an undergraduate student of the College in any faculty and any elected member of the Council shall by becoming such an undergraduate student of the College, ipso facto vacate his seat in the Council.

Any graduate of the University of Manitoba or of any other University shall be eligible for admission as a graduate of the College by grace of the Council provided that he previously make the payment to the Steward for being placed on the Boards of the College, but no qualification shall give a right to anyone to have his name placed on the Boards of the College. This shall only be done by grace of the Council if the Council see fit. And the Council may at any time remove from the Boards of the College the name of anyone on the Boards who has been convicted in the Courts of Law of any criminal or immoral proceeding.

Every member of the Council elected as provided in this statute, will be subject to Statute 2 as regards membership of the Church of England in Rupert's Land and shall before taking his seat at the Council make the declaration that has to be made by all members of the Council.
