On leaving us after Mass she said she would call in the evening for me to go to see a gentleman who was interested in us. In the evening share and took me to her house with m, mother, and asked me to see a gentleman in a room by myself. She introduced him to me, and I found he was a Jesuit Father. When alone, he wanted me to go on my knees and make a confession, and I said I could not as I was too much upset. He repeatedly said to me, "Do not be afraid to tell me, for you know I am a priest." He then began to question me in detail as to what I had been doing since I left the Abbey, and I told him. I still refused to make a confession, and he gave me
