UNITED STATES ARMY HAS LOST MANY MEN

Every Possible Effort is Being Made to Secure Re-Enlistment and Recruits.

(From The Tribune Bureau.) WASHINGTON, Nov. 4.—The artillery, cavalry and infantry of the United States army have lost so heavily by failure to re-enlist, by desertion and by discharges and by desertion that the situation is felt to be serious by the officers charged with the duty of maintaining the enlisted strength of the standing army.

Every possible effort is being made by the war department and the general staff to remedy the situation, to induce re-enlistments and to secure recruits, but with little avail, while the smaller the army grows the greater becomes the necessity for frequent change, the harder become the duties of the men remaining in the ranks and the more unattractive becomes the service as a whole.

JABEL ROBINSON ILL

Is Prominent Former Member of House of Commons.

ST. THOMAS, Nov. 4.—Jabel Robinson, ex-M.P., is reported seriously ill at his home in Middlemarch, and his recovery is not expected. Dr. Marliat of St. Thomas is in attendance. Mr. Robinson is one of the best known men in the county, and is known all over Canada, he having been for years the president of the Dominion Grange, as well as having represented West Elgin in the house of commons for five years, succeeding the late George E. Casey. He is also a former councillor of Southwood Township, and in the St. Thomas council when the new city was a small place, and had the distinction of being chief of police of the town. He has been engaged in farming for years, but at one time was a contractor in the city.
