### IGNATIUS DONNELLY'S DEATH.

Heart Failure Was the Cause of the Sudden Taking Off of the "Sage of Nininger."

Minneapolis, Minn., Jan. 2.—Ignatius Donnelly, politician and author, was taken suddenly in his last night while visiting at the home of his father-in-law, Martin Hanson, and died at 12:03 this morning, aged 70. Mr. Donnelly, who was summoned, pronounced the trouble heart failure.

Ignatius Donnelly, known as "The Sage of Nininger," has been a prominent figure in the political and literary field for many years, and his death has been a great loss to the State.

He was born in 1830, and came to Minnesota 35 years ago, and was a member of both Houses of the State Legislature, and he was a member of the State Senate, and during his political career had been a member of many committees.

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### STAGE ROBBED IN B.C.

Masked Men With Rifles Secured \$450 From Passengers.
