adian Press).—Twelve hundred cemeteries scattered across France and Belgium will be constructed by the imperial war graves commission as final resting places for the thousands of soldiers of the British Empire who fell during the war. Some of these cemeteries have been completed under the direction of distinguished architects, but by far the greater number are yet to by far the greater number are yet to be constructed. In many of the cemeteries Canadian soldiers are, or will be, buried, and some of them will be composed largely, if not entirely, of Canadian graves. As the record of each cemetery is completed by the military authorities, it is handed over to the imperial war graves commission.

each cemetery is completed by the military authorities, it is handed over to the imperial war graves commission for marking, beautifying and care.

When a cemetery is completed a register is compiled, neatly bound in book form, containing photographs and descriptive matter in regard to the cemetery, and an alphabetical list of the soldiers buried there, with full particulars of rank, regiment, age, date of death, location of grave, and names of next of kin. These registers, when complete, form a complete roll of the cemetery. One copy, bound in leather, is left at the cemetery, other copies being sent to public libraries and institutions of that nature, while others have been sold, on application, at the cost of production.

The Canadian Government, having seen samples of the registers, and realizing what treasured possessions they will be to relatives of soidiers who are buried in the cemeteries, have decided to purchase sufficient copies of the register of each cemetery as it is published to supply the nearest relative of each soldier buried in the cemetery.
