HEAVY SNOWFALL.

Continuous Fall for Thirty Hours in Province of Quebec.

MONTREAL, Dec. 13.—Thirty hours' continuous snowfall in Montreal and through a large portion of the Province of Quebec is giving the railroads and the municipal authorities a severe battle to keep open the means of transportation.

The Canadian Pacific has half a dozen giant snowplows at work on its lines, between Montreal, Smith's Falls and Quebec, and the other railways are kept equally busy.

In Montreal it is estimated that the city more than \$1000 an hour to keep the streets open, without counting the cost to the street railway company.

The McGill Observatory records show a snowfall of over fourteen inches, an unusually heavy one for this season of the year.
