Of course there's something in the grounds, but it is not likely that the Nationals will win when they visit M.A.A.A. a week from next Saturday.

Here is the list of remaining games and you can figure out for yourself that the present champions, erstwhile Minto Cup chasers, have a long fight ahead of them to finish below one of the Toronto teams above the Nationals.
