## WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The following statement was received at a meeting of the W. & O. Committee, and ordered to be presented for publication in the next Annual Report of D.C.S.

The income of the Fund during the year 1872 was \$2136.30

derived from the following sources, viz:

Premiums of Clergy..... \$ 513.67 

This income is a little more than that of 1871.

The receipts from premiums of clergy are rather more, and the collections from parishes rather less, than the amounts counted upon when the fund was established. In several Parishes, however, it has been thought advisable to give their aid rather to the Superannuation Fund, as to the object most in need of building up. Annexed is a memo. of collections, etc., received during 1872.

During the past year payments have been made for pensions and expenses to the amount of \$1670, leaving \$466.30 to be added. to the capital. There are now forty-nine clergymen holding certifi-
