## Discip'ine

The system of education is paternal. The professors endeavor to unite kindness with firmness, and make use of means of persuasion and encouragement in preference to those of severity. For the exact observance of discipline and good order, moral influence, likewise, is had recourse to, as an incentive to the fulfilment of the duties prescribed.

All books, papers or pamphlets received by students are previously submitted to the approval of the Director who may also inspect the letters.

Each student should be provided with the Seminary uniform consisting in a black frock-coat, with pants and cap of same color. It is to be worn on Sundays, festivals, and public occasions.
