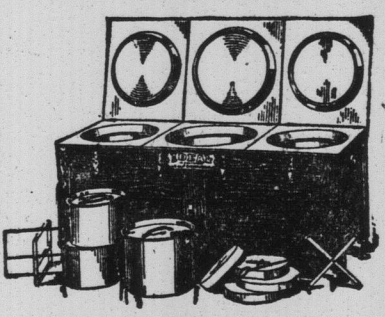

### GUILTY OF PLOT TO KILL LLOYD GEORGE

Mason, Wife, and Mrs. Wheelodon Sentenced—5 to 10 Years Penal Servitude—Harriet Wheelodon Acquitted

Mrs. Alice Wheelodon, her daughter, Mrs. Winifred Mason, and the latter's husband, Alfred George Mason, were found guilty on Saturday of conspiracy to murder Premier Lloyd George and Arthur Henderson, member of the war council. Miss Harriet Ann Wheelodon, another daughter, who also was tried on the same charge, was acquitted.

Mrs. Wheelodon was sentenced to ten years' penal servitude. A sentence of seven years was imposed upon Mason, and his wife was sentenced to five years' penal servitude.

Judge Low, in summing up, said that if the poison that figured in the case had been required for dogs, as had been asserted, it was unlikely that such particular poisons as the ones named would have been selected in such large quantity and with such secrecy and mystery. There was very slight chance against Harriet Wheelodon, who appeared to know nothing of the poisons, he said.

The judge commented on the singularity of the fact that the spy, Booth, had been called to give evidence, while Gordon was not required to testify, and the jurors considered the absence of Gordon fatal to the case of the prosecution, they were entitled to say so.

On the other hand the judge said, if the jurors were satisfied that the evidence substantiated the charges they could convict the prisoners.

The jury was out for consideration of its verdict for only twenty minutes.

Mrs. Wheelodon was found guilty on all counts—conspiring and soliciting to murder by poison. Mr. and Mrs. Mason were found guilty of conspiracy, but the jury recommended them to the mercy of the court because of their youth.

Judge Low, addressing Mrs. Wheelodon after the imposition of sentence, said he could imagine no worse crime than the one with which she was charged. He told Mason that but for the jury's recommendation he would have imposed the same sentence on him as he gave Mrs. Wheelodon. Regarding Mrs. Mason he said that doubtless her position was largely due to the wickedness of her mother.

Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, suffrage leader, by permission of Judge Low, went to the witness box to controvert a statement alleged to have been made by Mrs. Wheelodon in the recent trial, that Pankhurst had spent £300 in an attempt to poison Premier Lloyd George by driving a poisoned nail into his boot.

Pankhurst declared that such a statement was absolutely false in every particular, adding:

"The Women's Social and Political Union regards the premier's life as of the greatest value. It is a crime of the first order, and its members would, if necessary, take great risks themselves to protect it from danger."

Pope Honors Chicago Packer's Wife for Support of Catholic Works

Chicago, March 12.—Mrs. Catherine Cudahy, widow of Michael J. Cudahy, packer, has been made a papal countess by Pope Benedict XV. This was announced by Archbishop Mundelein following the receipt of official documents from Rome. Mrs. Cudahy is the first Chicago woman to be so honored either by the Pope or any other sovereign. ### MEN AS INSTRUCTORS

Bringing Them Back Will Aid in Training Recruits and Give Veterans Well Earned Respite

Some of the soldiers who went to France with the First Canadian Contingent are being brought back to Canada and will be placed on instructional staffs in the various military districts. At present plans are being prepared to bring back a few of the first contingent men.

It is considered that the instructions the soldiers will receive in Canada will shorten their stay in England. The returned officers who have been instructing in Canada will be given much assistance by the returned soldiers.

The unofficial announcement that members of the first contingent will be brought home to act as instructors is well received by soldiers who have been wounded and are now discharged. They say their comrades are entitled to the well-earned rest.
