Ottawa, Dec. 18—Representative liberals from all parts of Canada will gather in Ottawa on Monday, to meet Sir Wilfrid Laurier and discuss questions of vital moment to Canada. The gathering will consist of laymen, senators and members of parliament, and the members of the provincial legislatures. 
