It was also decided to ask the attorney-general to take action to prevent flagrant violations of the recent amendments of the criminal code, especially those which refer to gambling. J. C. Mills, of Sussex, was elected as president, and the executive was authorized to consider the appointment of a full time field secretary from September I, 1923. Rev. H. A. Goodwin consented to act as honorary general secretary for the current year. Dr. J. G. 
