35 WILD STEERS TERRIFY NEW YORK

Stampede from 40th Street to 19th, Scattering Into Three Bands—Led by a Black Runt.

Thirty-five black Kentucky steers stampeded the other afternoon from the corner of Joseph Street at 600 West Fortieth street, New York, and with heads down and tails straight out, started out to cut a wide swath across Manhattan Island. From Fortieth street to Nineteenth and between Tenth avenue and the North River they left a trail of excitement and breathless crowds. All were finally captured, and this morning they are steaks.

An undomestic critter with wild eyes started the trouble directly it set foot on Manhattan Island after a short stay in pens on the Jersey side of the river. Apparently smelted some impending doom in the abattoirs, and with a wild bellow started away from its captors. Thirty-four other loud bellows and thirty-four other black steers clattered in pursuit.

Three small children were playing in the otherwise quiet street when this black wall started to move down upon them. Patrolman William McLaughlin of the West Thirtieth street station saw the danger and, with a shout that matched the combined vocal efforts of the steers, started to get the children out of the way. The four hustled into the shanty of a New York Central watchman as the black avalanche shot past.

At Tenth avenue the steers challenged the leadership of the black runt that started the stampede, and three groups started out in as many directions. Patrolman McLaughlin and volunteer assistants hurried up as about twenty-five slackened pace, and banded them together in the vacant lot in West Thirtieth street, where Patrolman Neville was slain by gangsters a few months ago.

Three of the wildest of the other ran on south in Tenth avenue. Sergeant Frederick Hillman of the West Thirtieth street station was startled at Twenty-third street when he saw two black objects catapulting toward his post.

Then he and other witnesses saw a sight even more strange—a light auto-

mobile dashed alongside of one of the steers and a husky hand grabbed the flying animals' tail. With a spurt of speed the automobile broke the speed limits for automobiles, and the steer in terrorped his pphulsive movements with kicks. The man let go and the steer flew on.

A few minutes later he and another black comef terrified several hundred commuters at the Twenty-third street ferry before the police chased them into a corner and quieted their panic. It was found that each of these two steers had broken a leg in running on the pavements.

Refugee No. 1, the black runt went all the others better. He dashed on to Pier 60 at Nineteenth street while 200 steers passengers were coming ashore from the White Star liner Baltic, and took possession of the premises. Mounted Patrolman Joseph Carly urged his horse after the steer and brought the animal down with the first shot. It was up again in a minute and off on another dash down the pier. The second shot ended that.

Meanwhile policemen at Thirty-ninth street were taking precautions against a second stampede. Several motor trucks were brought up and in the centre of a solid square of motor vehicles the black herd was gradually moved to the establishment where bad steers are turned into good steaks.

LIQUOR CASE RESUMED.

Walter W. Bell gave evidence yesterday in the case against him on a charge of having liquor in his beer shop. He told the same story as at the hearing of the last charge against him. He said he saw the inspectors flash their lights through a partition into the cellar next door, which he said belonged to a Mr. Wall. He swore he had not had any liquor in his shop since he was convicted of a violation of the act on December 12.
