We desire to work with the great republic in all parts of the world. Like it, we want stability and peace on the basis of liberty and justice; like it, we desire to avoid the growth of armaments whether in the Pacific or elsewhere; and we rejoice that American opinion is showing so much earnestness in that direction at present. We are ready to discuss with American statesmen any proposal for limitation of armaments which they may wish to set out, and we can undertake that no such overtures will find any lack of willingness on our part to meet them."

This declaration of sentiment and of the saturation of Saturday Hon. Macken-zic King pointed out that Canada is the only British country whose people have been denied the right since the termination of the war to choose a government.
