



Hundreds of men and women had devoted their whole time during the war to works of mercy. Canada with her small population had given millions sterling to the society, but not one of the workers in England had received recognition.

Hundreds of decorations had been given to the British Red Cross Society and other dominions for this work. Onrs were neglected because ninety-six members of the Canadian House of Commons passed a resolution asking the king to refrain from granting titular honors or distinctions to Canadian citizens.
