HIGH PRICES FOR HERRING. Grand Manan Fishermen Get \$34 a Hoghead at Eastport; Big Catches Are Made.

Eastport, Nov. 24.—Several more boat loads of small herring were brought to this city on Friday and work was resumed in the factories of the Blanchard Mfg. Co., and the E. A. Holmes Co. The fish brought as high as \$34 a hoghead.

In several instances, the highest price paid for many years and the fishermen of Grand Manan on the Canadian side are reaping the benefit of the high price. All the season, while fish were selling for \$6 a hoghead none were caught at Grand Manan and the fishermen were almost discouraged but now that they are being caught in such large quantities and very high prices prevail, many of the weir men expect to do a fairly good season's work in three weeks. But one more week of the sardine season remains.

TO THE LARGER MARKET. Summerside Farmer — H. S. Jones shipped another 100 head of those "nexus" cattle from Summerside on Monday morning for the U. S. market. He has another 60 head rounded up ready to go this (Wednesday) morning. This will complete his cattle shipments.

NEW YORK Y.M.C.A. FUND IS NEARING \$4,000,000 MARK

New York, Nov. 24.—John D. Rockefeller, Jr., today contributed \$25,000 to the \$4,000,000 fund being raised for the Young Women's and Young Men's Christian Associations. The total pledges at 8 o'clock this afternoon amounted to \$8,427,247.

The committee in charge were confident of raising the rest of the \$4,000,000 before the time limit expires tomorrow night. Contributions today were \$483,900. A member of Mr. Rockefeller's Sunday school class, who is captain of the team working for the big fund, called him on the telephone and asked him to give \$1,000.

George W. Perkins, chairman of the executive committee in charge of the campaign, said he had pledges of \$207,000 and would announce the names of the donors later.

The pledge of \$100,000 made conditional at upon the collection of \$4,000,000 by noon today was in advance and will be available, it was announced this afternoon, if a total of \$4,400,000 is raised before tomorrow night.

McGILL STUDENTS ON THE RAMPAGE

Montreal, Nov. 24.—After two years non-observance, the McGill Theatre Night was resurrected tonight but came to an inglorious end, when midway through the second act the Glad Eye Company refused to go on with their play and the curtain was rung down.

The students went back to Molson's Hall where the faculty had prepared a supper for them but here again pandemonium broke loose and after a short scrap between the Sophs and Freshmen, the body broke up into little parties who continued the celebration in the streets.

EVENING SUITS IN BLUE FOR MEN

London, Nov. 23.—Striking fashions for men are seen in "Are You There?" at the Prince of Wales Theatre. The producers of the play called in the assistance of an expert in men's clothes, H. Dennis Bradley, to evolve new fashions for the piece, and gave him a free hand.

Three distinct color schemes have been carried out for the dressing of the first act, in which the men wear lounge suits of various shades of blue, brown and gray. All the usual shades of dark navy blue have been passed over as being too ordinary. In their place are three distinct shades of blue—purple blue, royal blue, plum blue, and china blue.

The brown suits are mostly in an autumnal shade—warm browns with tints of red in them. One is, apparently, a "suit" of a "suit" of gray suits vary in shade from black and white grays to bright silver grays. In striking contrast to these is Lawrence Cross-Smith's smartly cut black-braided jacket, fastened at the waist-line with one button.

In the second act all the chorus wear evening suits of blue, the coat being faced with blue silk. A new kind of evening overcoat—blue with blue silk facings and fastened with only one button—has been specially devised for this act. Another new kind of evening overcoat is worn by Alice Fraser. It has silk lapels rolling right down to the bottom of the coat—hardly an overcoat for the very cold weather, but an extremely smart coat to slip over evening clothes. Mr. Fraser's bright blue evening suit, with its white corded waistcoat, is one of the sartorial successes of the production.

Mr. Cross-Smith wears an evening suit of another shade of blue, and with it a silk waistcoat of a light biscuit shade. amounting to over 200 head, from the island this season. He shipped another 600 lambs to Boston on Tuesday morning, and the end is not yet.
