

ECLIPSES IN 1850.

There will be 5m. Eclipses in the year 1850, in the following order:

The first will be of the Sun February 28th at 9h. 20m. in the morning, invisible in this Province.

The second of the Moon March 9th, at 9h. 10m. in the morning, visible here.

The third of the Sun March 24th, at 10h. 30m. in the morning, invisible here.

The fourth of the Sun August 18th, at 7h. 30m. in the morning, invisible here.

The fifth of the Moon September 2d. partly visible.

Beginning of the Eclipse : 1 2 3 4 : 4h. 36m. afternoon.

Beginning of total darkness : 1 2 3 4 : 5h. 33m.

Ecliptic conjunction : 1 2 3 4 : 6h. 25m.

Middle : 1 2 3 4 : 6h. 24m.

End of total darkness : 1 2 3 4 : 7h. 14m.

End of the Eclipse : 1 2 3 4 : 8h. 12m.

Digits eclipsed 21°. 40'. from the northern side of the Earth's shadow.

The sixth will be of the Sun September 16, at 10h. 14m. afternoon, of course invisible here.

II. Venus will be the Evening star until the seventh of March; from that time morning star to the twentieth of December.

III. The Sun's Declination is for Noon at the Meridian of Greenwich, consequently it is the declination for 7h. 46m. in the morning at Halifax.
