New York, Jan. 2.—An annulment of her marriage to Ferdinand Pinney Earle, the artist, was granted to Mrs. Julia Kuttner Earle in the appellate division of the Supreme Court Friday. Action was brought by Mrs. Earle, who was married to Mr. Earle in Venice, Italy, March 17, 1908. It was just prior to this marriage that Mr. Earle took the public lion by his confidence by announcing that he had discovered his heart's twin.  
The artist married in March, 1903, Marie Emille Fishbacher, in Paris. He lived with her a few years. She obtained a divorce.
