IRMA JAY WINS BIG EVENT AT POUGHKEEPSIE

Saudine Takes 2.21 Trot and Jess Y Wins 2.13 Event After Six Heats—Russell Boy Wins.

Poughkeepsie, N. Y., Aug. 28.—Irma Jay, the favorite, owned and driven by Harvey Ernest of Kamona, Ohio, today won the Poughkeepsie 211 trot for a purse of \$3,000, the feature event of the opening day of the Grand Circuit meeting. After losing the first heat to Royal Mac, Irma Jay won the second and third heats in a driving finish.

Walter Cox's North Spur was picked to win the 211 trot, but Suidine had too much speed for him and won in straight heats. The 213 trot went six heats before Jesse Y, the popular choice, was returned a winner.
