51. All contraventions of this Act, and of regula- punishable. tions or orders lawfully made or given under it, when the Militia, or that portion thereof to which the offender belongs, is not called out for actual service, shall be punishable by penalties to be imposed by one or more Justices of the Peace, and in a summary manner, as hereinafter provided, and courts martial shall not be held

Offences, how

52. The Commander-in-Chief shall have full power Powers of Comto call out the Militia, or any part thereof, whenever it shall, in his opinion, be advisable so to do, by reason of war, invasion, or insurrection, or imminent danger of any of them.

53. The Colonel commanding any military district, Powers of Coor the Lieutenant-Colonel commanding any battalion tricts. division, shall have power, upon any sudden emergency of invasion or insurrection, or in imminent danger of either, to call out the whole, or any part of the Militia within his command, until the pleasure of the Commander-in-Chief shall be known.

54. The Militia so called out by their Colonel or Lieutenant-Colonel, shall immediately obey all such orders as he may give, and march to such place, within or without the division, as he shall direct.

Militia bound

55. When the Militia of any local division are Volunteer forces called out in case of war, insurrection, or invasion, included in call-or imminent danger thereof, all Companies of Volun- birosion. teers in such division shall be included in the order, and shall obey the officer issuing it.

56. When the whole Militia of the Province are called out, all the Volunteer Companies shall be the whole Militia included, and shall immediately obey the orders they shall receive.

64. Any Volunteer Companies so called out for Battalians of the actual service, may be embodied into Battalions, if Active Force. the Commander-in-Chief shall think fit so to order.
