UNB Cast Makes Bid For Festival

The UNB Drama Society's cast for their forthcoming production, *FORTUNE, MY FOE*, is made up of names which have become widely known to university audiences. The Society's Director, Alvin Shaw stated, "I feel extremely fortunate to be working with such an experienced and well-rounded cast. All the actors have gained considerable stage experience and none are appearing for their first time here at UNB. Many of them took part in last year's highly successful *DEATH OF A SALESMAN* which was invited to compete in the Dominion Drama Festival held in Victoria, B.C. With the talent in this show, it is shaping into another excellent production." Headlining the ten member

cast are Myron Mitton and Kate Lewis, who will be remembered for their performances in previous Drama Society plays. The other two lead roles are in the capable hands of Graham Whitehead and Geoffery Eathorne, both of whom have directed, as well as acted, for the Society. The supporting cast is admirably filled out by Alvin Shaw, Hilary Harding, Jim Embury, Derek Hamilton, Barbara Ramsay and Gordon Cunningham.

FORTUNE, MY FOE is a Canadian play by Robertson Davies. Mr. Davies is a well-known author and some of his works include *THE DIARY OF SAMUEL MARCHBANKS*, and *THE CENTENNIAL PLAY*.

FORTUNE, MY FOE is a witty comedy set in Kingston, Ontario. The action of the play takes place in an illegal bar run by the inscrutable "Chilly Jim" Steele. Two of his more frequent customers are two English professors, the younger of whom, in order to win the charming Vanessa Medway, wishes to emigrate to the United States. His desire to do so causes a serious conflict with his older colleague which lies at the centre of the play.

In Chilly Jim's employ is an Hungarian refugee who wants to get started in Canada in his previous profession of puppeteer. To help him get established, the habitues of the bar arrange to show his work to the local

Recreation Committee. In the ensuing disastrous, but humorous consequences, Robertson Davies has some rather disparaging things to say about Canadian culture.

FORTUNE, MY FOE is the UNB entry in this year's New Brunswick Regional Drama Festival to be held in Gagetown. It will be shown to university audiences at The Playhouse on Friday, Saturday and Monday, February 17, 18 and 20 at 8:30 p.m. All tickets are free to UNB students and they may be picked up at any time from the Drama Society Workshop in the basement of Memorial Hall.
