Dear King, -

During the last three weeks I have on different occasions taken some time trying to find out what the law is at the present time governing a general election if the House were to be now dissolved.

The one result of my efforts has been to eatisfy me that the Minister of Justice was pre-eminently <u>right</u> if he said it was "something of a conundrum", for a worse mess it would be difficult for even the present Government to create.

It is impossible to say there is anything about it which is certain.

The matter is probably not now of any consequence for I assume that the Bill on the subject which has been introduced will clear the situation by repealing all, or some, of the hideous legislation passed during the last three years so that we can at least know where we are.
