I beg to acknowledge the receipt of Dr J. Chan. L. Bussier account rendered at \$156.00 which you forwarded, together with a letter which he addressed to you in regard thereto; and in reply I beg to say that in view of the charges made the questic of payment can not be considered. The account is therefore returned herewith.

If the doctor was at Dereimie when he was asked to render the attendence he should only have charged the usual mileage rate (50% one way) for the distance travelled in going to his patients .

The charges made for medicines are altogether too high.

It is usual to allow 50¢ for each prescription. In cases where expensive drugs have, administered a charge of 75¢ or \$1.00 would be allowed. Eindly explain the matter to the doctor.
