the call to sustain the cause of Peace and Freedom.

Today, if that cause is to be maintained, we too must press forward. We must come to see that Peace and Freedom cannot be secured through inaction; that they can be achieved only through continuous and constructive effort. Reason, Patience, and Goodwill must be made to prevail in the councils of men and nations. They are positive, not passive, forces. In this very year we have witnessed the power of all three. It remains for us to ensure their triumph through the years to come.
