- A.93 No Sir.
- Q.94 What time should you have been back at Haxted House that night?
- A.94 Ten o'clock, I think.
- Q.95 When was the last time you saw Mr. Corbett on the night of 24/25 December before you went to bed?
- A.95 When I was in the room with Crouch and Col. Coombs.
- Q.96 When was the next time you saw him, the next Morning?
- A.96 When he came in with Col. Coombs.
- Q.97 He was fully dressed both times was he not?
- A.97 Yes.
- Q.98 When you went into Orchard House the first time, were Mr. Corbett and Col. Coombs together?
- A.98 I do not know.
- Q.99 The four of you went into one room you said?
- A.99 Yes Sir.
- Q.100 Miss Sedgwick, there is a considerable element of doubt with regard to the question "who went away from the Mess with you after you had been there the first time and had a dozen drinks". That was quite a lot?
- A.100 I did have a lot.
- Q.101 When you say Mr. Corbett with the other two officers, Crouch and yourself, it is said with the knowledge that you had quite a bit to drink?
- A.101 Yes.
- Q.102 Pte. Crouch doesn't agree with that, she says there were only two officers who went with you and came back with you the second time. Would you be in a position to deny that?
- A.102 I'm telling you as I remember it.
- Q.103 It seemed to be established yesterday that Col. Coombs arrived at the Mess about 1130 rather than 10 o'clock, would that also be as far as you could remember the time?
