An incorporated Village in Stanstead County, Quebec, on the Coaticook River with a Station on the Grand Trunk Railway, 122 miles South East of Montreal. It is a Port of Entry has a U.S. Consulate office and contains 5 Churches, 5 Hotels, 30 Stores, Registry Office and Court House, Telegraph Office, one Bank, one Academy, one Convent, one Model School and two Common Schools, one Building Society, one Cheese Factory.
