THE CROSS.

THE greatest wonder in the whole universe is the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, who was God manifest in flesh and crucified and slain by wicked hands, by those who were debtors to Him for "life, and breath and all things." For a while, when dead and buried, Jesus seemed conquered. "He was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification." (Rom. iv. 25). "And by Him all that believe are justified from all things." (Act xiii. 39).

"Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ," (Rom. v. 1.)
