It enables us not only to transmit ordinary conversation with perfect distinctness to the most distant points through the telephone, but also to render the faintest sounds audible in the same manner. When we are told that the brushing of a soft camel's hair pencil over a wooden surface can be made to produce an intensely loud noise in r microphone a hundred miles away, and ex a that the foot fall of a fly can be heard at a distance by the same instrumentality, we are at first inclined to regard it as an ingenious scientific joke. The discovery is, however, no deception; and the apparatus by which the seeming miracle is wrought is as simple as the telephone itself. Never were such astonishing results obtained by means so commonplace and cheap.
