*Resolved*, That this House do agree to the said amendment, and that the Clerk do carry the Bill back to the Council and acquaint them therewith.

Then the House adjourned until to-morrow, at half-past ten of the clock.

Whereas the improvement of the New Road leading from Dartmouth to Colchester Road, will much promote the convenience of the Eastern parts of the Province; and whereas the Money due from the County of Halifax for Grain, Flour, Meal, &c. supplied to indigent Settlers, has not yet been applied to the Road Service, under the Provisions of the Act, passed in the last Session of the General Assembly for that purpose: *Resolved*, that the sums so due, be applied to the use and service of the above mentioned Road, under the direction of the Commissioner of the said Road; which, being seconded and put, passed in the affirmative; and thereupon,

*Ordered*, That the Clerk do carry the foregoing Resolution to the Council, and desire their concurrence.
