Mr. Cameron moved that a Committee be appointed to prepare an Address to be presented to his Majesty, praying that his Majesty would be graciously pleased to remit the Quit Rent for this Island until the payment of the same is enforced in the neighbouring Provinces of Nova. Scoua and New-Brunswick, and that his Majesty would be pleased to allow us to raise an assessment on Land in heu thereof, for the purpose of erect. ing a Government House and other Pub. lic Buildings and Colonial improvements. Ordered accordingly. Mr. Cameron, Mr. Cambridge, and Mr. Campbell, were appointed a Committee for that purpose.
