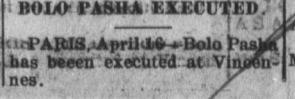

## KINGS COUNTY ORGANIZATION FOR NATIONAL MILITARY Y. M. C. A., Three Day FINANCIAL CAMPAIGN.

We, National Council, of the Military Y. M. C. A. have decided upon May 7, 8, 9, for a campaign to raise their financial budget this year. The amount asked from all Canada is \$2,250,000: of Nova Scotia \$150,000, and of Kings County \$6,500.

The Provincial Council has asked Mr. E. B. Newcombe of Kentville to act as County Chairman for Kings. Through Mr. Newcombe an organization meeting for the County was called at Kentville April 15th at 1 o'clock and delegates from all sections of the County were present. The meeting was addressed by Mr. D. G. Cock, the Provincial Director of the Campaign, and by Capt. Kneale, Chief of the Military Y. M. C. A. staff of the Province. The former gave facts regarding the growth of the campaign organization throughout the province and the later gave a vivid picture of the services of the "Y" for our soldiers at Halifax.

The meeting confirmed Mr. E. B. Newcombe's appointment, and Mr. Geo. A. Chase of Port Williams, lately returned from the front was appointed Organizer for the Campaign and Mr. Geo. C. Roy of the Bank of Nova Scotia, secy-treasurer. These officers together with Dr. H. T. DeWolfe of "Acadia" constitute the executive.
