Township Councils.

DOVER COUNCIL

The council met as Court of Revision on Hind drain repair at Raymond's Hall, Mitchell's Bay, Nov. 7. The members were all present except Mr. Hind. There was but one appeal.

Moved by Lewis and King, that having heard Wm. Roberts in evidence on his appeal, the assessment on the n. e. 1-4 in 10th concession be struck out, the rest of the assessment be sustained and the Court of Revision be closed.—Carried.

The council met. The minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted. Judge Bell's judgment was read on the matter of the appeals on Rivard drain improvement. Mr. McGeorge's report and the report of Andrew Brown, commissioner, on the completion of the Dyer drain repair were read. The 5th concession Mechanical Drain by-law was read and provisionally adopted and copies ordered to be served on the ratepayers.

Rivard drain improvement by-law, the McFarlane drain repair by-law and the Hind drain repair by-law were read and finally passed. The grievance of T. S. Cartwright was referred to Mr. Lewis with power, and the grievance of Thos. Alexander referred to Mr. Lewis and the Clerk with power.

Moved by Lewis and King, that A. McDonnell's report on the Boyle drain repair be adopted and the Clerk serve a copy on the Reeve of Chatham Township, and that a by-law be prepared.—Carried.

Mr. McDonnell's account, \$130, was ordered paid for surveying Doyle drain, making plans, estimates and assessments and reporting in duplicate; also his account of \$5 for measuring e. pt. lot 15 in 2nd concession for Court purposes re appeals on Rivard drain improvement. The Planet account, \$2.40, for advertising, ordered paid.

Judge Bell's account, \$6.10, be paid for holding Court one day at Town Hall, mileage and postage, on Rivard appeals.—Carried.

Moved by Boyer and King, that Andrew Brown, commissioner, be paid \$34.50 for 23 days overseeing the work of repairing Dyer drain.—Carried.

Moved by King and Lewis, that Dr. R. Ingram's account, \$61, be paid for medicine and medical attendance on Ida McCarthy, an indigent.—Carried.

Moved by Lewis and Boyer, that Francis L. Emery be paid \$1.50 for inspecting W. H. Chappell's sheep killed by dogs.—Carried.

Moved by Boyer and King, that Mr. Lewis be appointed commissioner to let and superintend the work of repairing the Hind drain and report.—Carried.

The council adjourned and met at the Town Hall as a Court of Revision on the Hyatt drain repair and on the Dolson Creek Mechanical drain improvement. The members were all present. The Court of Revision on Dolson Creek drain organized. On motion of Mr. Lewis and Boyer, Samuel Bagnell's appeal was allowed to be heard. On motion of Mr. Boyer and King, Mrs. Jos. Jubinville's appeal was heard.

Moved by Boyer and Hind, that the Court of Revision on the Dolson Creek drain be adjourned till Nov. 28 to allow the Clerk time to notify the parties appealed against at this meeting.—Carried.

Moved by Hind and King, that having heard David Clark in evidence on his appeal against the assessment on the s. w. pt. n. w. 1-2 lot 20 in concession 14, for the repair of Hyatt drain, the appeal be dismissed, the engineer's assessment be sustained and the Court of Revision be closed.—Carried.

The council met. The minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted. Mr. Shackleton's report on the improvement of the Fryer drain and Branet was read.

Moved by Hind and Lewis, that Wm. Onelle be appointed commissioner to let and superintend the work of repairing the Hyatt drain and to report when the work is completed.—Carried.

Moved by Lewis and King, that the grievance of John McDonald be referred to the Reeve and Mr. Hind with power.—Carried.

Moved by Lewis and Hind, that the grievance of certain ratepayers on Wood's Survey be referred to Mr. Boyer with power.—Carried.

Theodore Charron, John Richmond and James Fox were paid \$1 each for pathmasters' returns. The account of St. Joseph's Hospital, \$5.58, was paid for nursing and attendance on Mary Dobson. R. Cooper's account, \$11.83, was paid for stationery.

Moved by Boyer and Hind, that Mr. Shackleton's account, \$17.00, be paid for making plans and report on Fryer drain and branch improvement.—Carried.

Postage account, \$2.95, was ordered paid.

Moved by Hind and King, that Mr. Shackleton's report on the Fryer drain and Branet improvement be adopted and the Clerk prepare a by-law.—Carried.

Moved by Lewis and Hind, that H. N. Bechtel be appointed commissioner to let and superintend the work of repairing and improving the Rivard drain, the engineer to finally receive the work.—Carried.

The grievance of Thomas Stokes was referred to the Reeve with power.

The Reeve and Clerk were appointed to sell the debentures on certain drains.

The council adjourned.

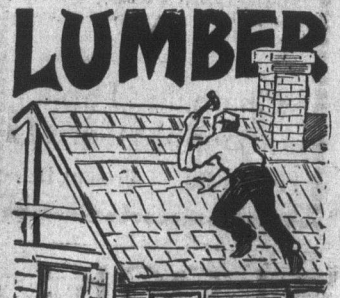
