PERPETUAL MOTION.

W. H. Russell, of Miramichi, Claims Practically to Have Solved the Problem.

W. H. Russell, a native of Miramichi (N. B.), at present residing in Sydney, holds the patent rights in the United States and Canada on an invention which, if it proves workable, will revolutionize the industries of the world. Mr. Russell claims to be able to harness hydraulic jacks, automatic, into power. In short, by means of a number of hydraulic jacks he will develop a power which will run machinery or do anything required of it. All that is necessary is to place the jacks in the starting position. Then they will run themselves. No steam or electric power will be required. It is the old story of perpetual motion, and Mr. Russell believes he has solved the problem. He states that he has submitted the plans of his patent to many competent engineers and none of them could find a flaw or see any reason why the scheme was not workable. In addition to his great invention, Mr. Russell holds patents on a number of inventions in connection with the machinery used in the running of electric railroads. Among these are a patent trolley wheel, which will carry a month's oil and run for six months, while the ordinary life of a trolley wheel is but six weeks. There is also a clipper car for an overhead wire holder, and a curve taking trolley harp. These articles have all been manufactured and a number of them are in use on various roads, where they are giving the best satisfaction. Mr. Russell holds recommendations from the superintendents of the Lexington and Boston and Newton railroads, in whose employ he has been.

The inventor is now working at Glace Bay, where he has had charge of erecting one of the towers for the Marconi station—Sydney Record.

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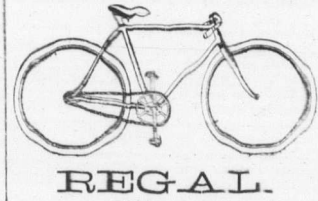
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
