## NATURAL GAS KILLS TWO MEN

**Workmen Boring Well At Regina,  
Saskatchewan, Were Suffi-  
cated Yesterday.**

### WITHDRAWN TOO LATE

REGINA, Sask., Wednesday. — While boring a dry well on John Bolan's farm some twelve miles south of this city two London, Ontario men named Wm. Regan and J. Richardson were suffocated by gases at the bottom. After dynamiting a rock in the well Richardson went down to the bottom, giving a cry of distress as soon as he reached it. Regan called to a nearby threshing crew

for help, which was furnished promptly by one of the rescuers going part of the way down but had to be hauled back again. Regan volunteered to go down refusing a rope saying there was no time. Hardly had he reached the bottom when he was overcome. Before any further attempt could be made to save them both men were dead.

## LAURIER RETURNS TO OT- TAWA AFTER NIAGARA TRIP

treal in Evening.**

### DUTIES HOLD SCOTT

OTTAWA, Wednesday. — Sir Wilfrid Laurier returned to Ottawa this morning greatly pleased with his meeting at Niagara and well satisfied with the prospect in Ontario for the coming election. This afternoon he attended a meeting of the Cabinet and will leave for Montreal this evening. It is understood that the retirement of Hon. R. W. Scott will

not take place for some days yet as there is a number of matters in the department of the Secretary of State in connection with the coming election which require his attention.

## BALLOON STRUCK BY SQUALL

**Great Perceval Airship Buckles in Mid Air And Lands  
On House Top.**

### AERONAUTS SAFE

BERLIN, Wednesday. — The Perceval air ship buckled in the air this morning and had to come to ground. At the time of the accident the air ship was running with the great balloon in the direction of Dohritz, where Emperor William was waiting to see them. Both air ships started out this morning between 8 and 9 o'clock with the object of seeing which would reach Dohritz in the shortest time. They faced a light breeze which freshened quickly until it was difficult for the balloons to make headway against it. When the Perceval air ship was crossing the Havel Lake it was struck by a squall

and the cigar shaped bag began to show signs of trouble. The interior balloon itself collapsed and the machine started slowly to come down. It cleared the waters of the lake and landed on the roof of a house. Major Von Perceval and his four companions alighted without sustaining any injury.

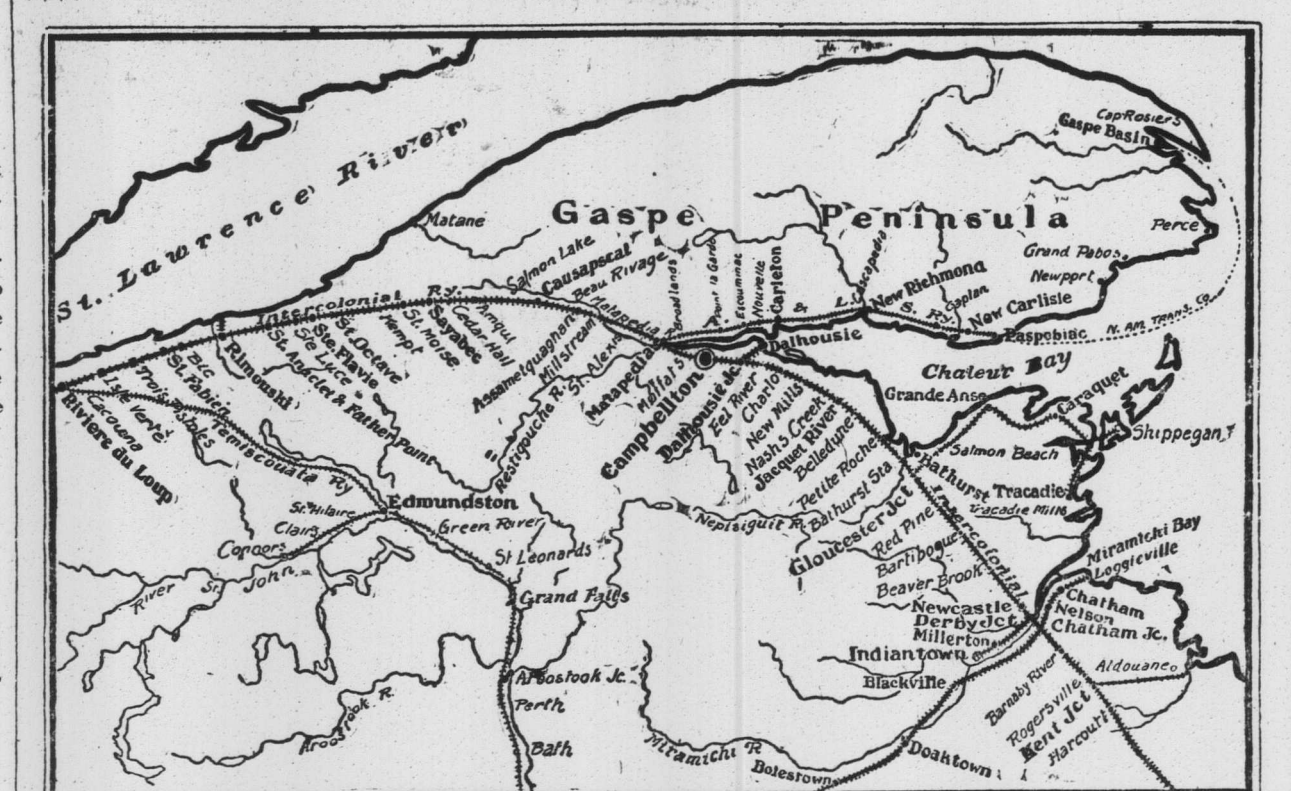

## ELECTION AT AN EARLY DATE

**Excellent Progress Being Made in the  
Voting Arrangements Makes  
Oct. 20th Possible.**

### COMES AS SURPRISE

**James Kendry Addresses the C. M.  
A. Convention On the Trade  
Conditions.**

### WOOLEN INDUSTRY FAILING

(Special News Service)  
MONTREAL, Wednesday. — Louis Simpson, manager of the Montreal Cotton Co., Valleyfield, addressing the C. M. A. Convention today stated that he favored a commission of serious men going to Europe to investigate trade conditions. He prophesied the finding that the protection afforded Canadian Manufacturers did not cover the difference in wages. He also endorsed the Georgian Bay scheme. Mr. James Kendry, of Peterboro, in commenting on the messages passing last July between the Association and Sir Wilfrid Laurier respecting increased duties on woolen goods, stated that unless the industry received some support it could no longer be carried on. He contended that deputations had gone to Ottawa

until they were tired and took issue with the Premier's statement that the government had given evidence of their appreciation of the woolen trade interests.
