A GOOD EXAMPLE. In the matter of subscribing for newspapers the Government sets a good example to the people. The departments expend a total of \$12,000 annually for this purpose and no doubt the informa-tion thus brought to the fountain head well repays the outlay. A story is told of one of the sub-heads, exclaiming: "At last I have found an honest news paper man. Here's a publisher who credits us with \$2 on a subscription of old on the 28th. which we would have no recollection." The bill read :- "To two year's subscription to the Care Breton \_\_\_\_\_, \$12; by amount overpaid on last account, \$2; balance, \$10." The correspondents to whom he spoke quietly got the file of the paper and pointed out that the ordinary subscription price of the weekly was \$1 a year!
