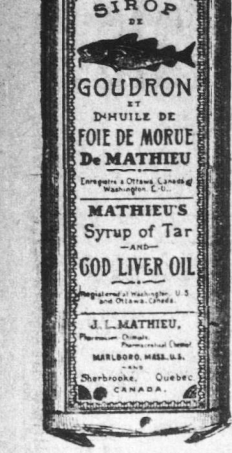

Ice Bound at Portugal Cove

On Saturday last the northern which has been lying in the vicin Cape St. Francis, drove in with Easterly winds, which made it difficult to land the goods to be taken to and from Bell Island quite possible. The mail service was discontinued, and the S. S. Mary was in St. John's, while the English is still roped up at the Cove. On day the ice jammed in together, making it almost impossible to walk ashore, but to land and behold! On Tuesday morning the ice had disappeared being drifted up the Bay. Word was then sent over the wires to St. John that the coast was clear and accordingly several business people of Bell Island who were in St. John's immediately set out on route and after most unpleasant and uncomfortable sleigh drive across the bleak coast to the utter disappointment and pleasant surprise of all it was found that another heavy load of ice had come in from the ocean, and once more blocked up the Tickle, making us all prisoners at Portugal Cove and here we are still ice-bound since Tuesday, being unable to proceed to the island or return over the snow-bound roads to St. John's. Among the number who are enjoying the rather unpleasant holiday are Messrs. J. Murphy, W. J. Steman, Jas. How J. Bowden, W. Duggan, J. M. Green and several others who came from the island are also among the ice-bound travellers. Thanks to the Irish hospitality, Miss Gladney and other kind ladies of the Cove, as well as to Messrs. Bull and Gosline we are glad to say time goes by pleasantly enough, but the enger wish of all to be landed once more safely on "Our Iron Isle."
