Wasteful Management

The reading of the Poor Asylum Report is distinctly depressing. It illustrates broadly the excessive cost of wanton waste and evil economy Before the Morris Government had entered upon office the pressing need of the abolition of the present Poor Asylum and a more humane provision for the aged who were too poor to provide for themselves was impressively and conclusively shown by the report of a Grand Jury, presided over by Mr. Gosling. The People's Party avowed they would take up the matter immediately they came into power but they did not do so, and the matter is now definitely deferred until a new Asylum for the insane is built, and the building at present utilized for the latter, can be converted into an institution for the poor. The resul of the policy of delay shows how evil economy may result in wantor waste. On account of the delay in providing a new Poor House, the expense of an electric lighting outfit has already been incurred. The Superintendant reports that further improvements of the present building have been determined on which will entail large expenditure. Here are the words of his report in that con liured at her home several weeks ago. nection "I understand the Government have in contemplation the providing of a new home for the poor This is a progressive step and mos timely and necessary. It is a matte: of public knowledge that the present building is entirely unfit for the purpose it is now supposed to fulfil. Improvements that entail any seriou expenditures have been postponed for quite a while past owing to the probability of the building being abandoned in a short time and the inmates removed to new quarters. It is now apparent that two or three years must elapse before such change can be made, and in view of this the Board of Works have recently resolved to give immediate attention to requirements that can no longer be delayed. Accordingly the following improvements have been recommended and I. C.
