A Monument to a Great Book Lover.

"The splendid memorial which George Widener (now Mrs. Rice) has erected at Harvard to the memory of her son, Mr. Harry Elkins Widener, who, with his father, was among the victims of the Titanic tragedy, will for all time be a literary Mecca," says the Times' Literary Supplement.

"It is the most sumptuous monument to a bibliophile in the world, just as Harry Widener, had he lived, would have become one of the greatest book collectors. The cadre of the library is entirely in keeping with the choice books and M.S.S. which it contains. If the splendour of the place is a trifle awe-inspiring, that is perhaps because the spirit of the mighty dead, both authors and collectors, seems to be present in a more concentrated form than in a library which has been built up by many hands at various times and with divergent tastes.

A Rare Young Man.

"It is rare indeed that a young man, heir to great riches, develops into a keen and discriminating collector before he leaves college. The number of youthful bibliophiles who developed into eminent collectors is greater than might be supposed. But generally speaking the book collector is not born young; he is the product of middle-age, when success has been obtained in the struggle for existence. In its way Harry Widener's example is unique both in taste and achievement. He collected those things in literature which will live. Some have passed through the crucial test of time, and of others the ultimate fate is one of which we at least to-day have no fear or doubt. In these matters, besides his own natural instinct, Harry Widener had the benefit of the experience and judgment of his friend, Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, who has, in his way, also erected a monument to the memory of Harry Widener in the catalogue, just privately printed in four quarto volumes, in which he has described fully the contents—books and manuscripts—of the Harry Elkins Widener Library at Harvard.

"The Stevenson, the Cruikshank, and the Dickens collections are undoubtedly the three great features of the Harry Widener Library. But one book opens another; and obviously a collector whose enthusiasm ranged from Dickens to Shakespeare set himself no limitations. In going through the two volumes of the general Catalogue Harry Widener's wide literary sympathies are manifested on nearly every page. And here, again, nearly every look has passed through some famous English library, except, of course, the first editions of modern American authors, such as T. B. Aldrich, Longfellow, O. W. Holmes, Whitier, E. A. Poe, and others, nearly all of whom are represented by presentation copies.

"The Shakespeare entries comprise a fine set of the four folios, the first of which belonged to Locker-Lampson, and was in the Van Antwerp sale at Sotheby's in March, 1907. The copy of the 1640 'Poems' is in the old sheepskin binding, and one of the two early quartos came from George Steevens's library and has his autograph on the title-page. Both Byron and Shelley were evidently favourites, and of each there are many first editions, all 'correct' from a bibliographical point of view, and many with special association interest. Among the many items of the two Brownings is a presentation copy of the first edition of 'Pauline,' 1833, given by Browning to Sarah Ficker Adams, author of 'Nearer, my God, to Thee,' who, at least in part, inspired the poem, according to a MS. note on the inside of the front cover; nearly all the Browning books are inscribed presentation copies. Rareties of personal and other interest are to be found among the entries under George Eliot, Swinburne, Thackeray, Charles Lamb, Thomas Gray, Edward FitzGerald, and many other names, familiar and otherwise.

Some Fine Nuggets.

"Occasionally Mr. Widener purchased books as examples of early English typography, for there are specimens from the presses of Caxton and Wynkyn de Worde, as well as from the Kelmscott Press of William Morris. Books illustrated by Kate Greenway, John Leech, William Blake, and others form a few of the leading features. Whilst in another direction we have, to name only a few, such desirable books as Dr. Johnson's New Testament, Dean Swift's copy of Sir Thomas Herbert's 'Persian Monarchy,' 1634, and Tennyson's 'Thucydides,' extensively annotated by him. But only the Catalogue itself can do justice to this remarkable collection, in which nearly every entry is a rarity of the first water—a 'nugget,' as the late Henry Stevens would have expressed it."
